A Classical and Christian Education

By Christian we mean first and foremost that this form of education is Christ-centered. This means all subjects are taught as part of an integrated whole with the Scriptures at the center. A clear model of the biblical Christian life is provided through the school's staff and board and every child is encouraged to begin and develop his relationship with God the Father through Jesus Christ.



By classical we mean a return to an older educational method, the trivium. The trivium consists of three stages, grammar, dialectic, and rhetoric. During the grammar stage students accumulate facts through observation and memory. With this wealth of knowledge students enter the dialectic stage where they are taught logic, or the art of reasoning well. The finishing of this classical education occurs in the rhetoric stage where students learn to apply knowledge and wisdom with eloquence.

A classical education is a liberal arts education, meaning it is broad in its scope, taking into consideration how each discipline is intertwined with the others. A liberal arts education



provides the student with the skills necessary to pursue any topic with relative ease because they have acquired the tools of learning. They know how to think and analyze various subjects and how to present what they know in an understandable and persuasive manner.

Character Development

The development of good character is a central element of the school. Matters of discipline are handled by focusing on the heart issue behind behavior. While this approach requires a greater investment of time, the character of our students is well worth it.
